A year full of great opportunities

Our new hallmark partner of 2023 was Texas Health Surgery Center Park Hill/SCA Health. On the surface, this partnership looks identical to our standing agreements with other area hospitals; however, Park Hill and PATC have streamlined the internal process to dramatically decrease the amount of paperwork and time that are needed to schedule patients for surgery. Finalized in June of 2023, Park Hill has guaranteed 48 cases per year to PATC patients, and because of the existing physician volunteers at that facility, we will greatly increase the number of general surgery, orthopedic surgery, and ophthalmology patients we are able to serve in 2024.

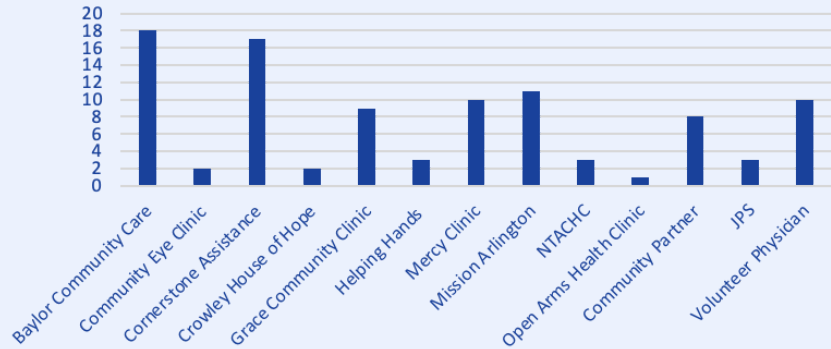
PATC will continue to provide high-quality specialty and surgical care to those most in need in Tarrant County.

Demographics & Data

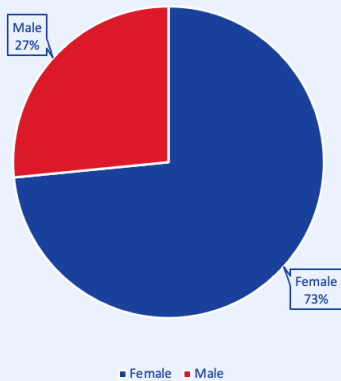
